The Rem/Cer Family: "Gratitude in Our Hearts" House

Lal (who goes by his last name, Rem) and Hlawn are the parents of two daughters and one son, Dawt, Genevieve, and Thawng respectively. Rem, Hlawn and their two older children



The Rem/Cer Family

came to the U.S. as refugees from Burma in 2011. Burma (*Myanmar*) has been entrenched in political turmoil for the past 50 years where a repressive military dictatorship has caused the displacement of more than 3.5 million Burmese.

Rem has been working as a Master Packer at **Tyson Foods** since a few months after their arrival. Hlawn stays home to care for their children. This family of five lives in a 2-bedroom apartment; the youngest daughter

shares a bedroom with her parents, while the two older children share the other bedroom. Their limited family income restricts them from being able to afford a larger apartment. One of their gravest concerns is for their children's safety, due to the reported presence of gangs at their school, which is across the street from their apartment complex. They are very ill at ease in allowing the children to play outside.

Rem and Hlawn long for a safe, adequate, and stable home for their family.

Rem and Hlawn have been completing their required *Sweat Equity* hours by volunteering at another *Habitat* family home build. Now that construction is in full swing on their house in Buford, Rem and Hlawn are excited to work on their own home.

During this interview, Rem said:

"At our first volunteer construction site we are so excited to see all of the volunteers and sponsors, especially when we started construction for our family. We have volunteered on other Habitat family homes but to actually work on our own home is thrilling. I thank God for all those who volunteer their time unselfishly, giving of themselves. I feel blessed that all of the sponsors and volunteers are working

hard as if they are building their own house. It is unbelievable that people I've never met in my life are helping us build for our family. Tears of joy well up in my eyes each time I see this. The longer I think about our home, the more blessed I realize we are. We will always feel gratitude in our hearts. This experience has made our family feel whole again. God has given us this opportunity to get a house. I would like to thank the Lord for what we received – the blessing of a new home for our family through Gwinnett Habitat for Humanity."

Walton Electric Trust Gives a Boost to the ABWK Program

Last week Walton Electric Trust presented Gwinnett Habitat with a check for \$10,000 to help purchase a cargo van. This van will support the operation of our home preservation and repair program, A Brush with Kindness (ABWK), for low-income elderly and disabled homeowners. We are grateful for this gift.

Who would have guessed that a cargo van would be such a powerful tool? Just imagine, all needed equipment and supplies for each project in one mobile location! What a vital means for increasing the number of low-income homeowners that can be helped. And since all the projects are completed with

volunteers, the number of projects accomplished with available funds are even greater. Twentyeight (28) home repairs have been completed in the past 18 months with very little advertising. Our dream is to be able to keep up with all the requests once we start widely advertising this program! The home repair cargo van will make that dream a reality.



Additionally, in December, Jackson EMC Foundation provided \$15,000 to support this same program. These funds supply needed materials for the preservation and repair projects we complete. Of course, like all Habitat projects, our volunteers make our projects affordable for low-income homeowners and prospective homeowners in our community.

We are also awaiting news on the status of three (3) other foundation grants that will pay for the balance of the cost of the van and the tools, equipment and supplies to outfit it. Executive Director's Corner

What do you think is the largest obstacle to fulfilling our mission at **Gwinnett Habitat?** It is not the lack of volunteers, community support, or even funds. It is appropriate properties for new home construction projects and existing home rehab projects. Without land we cannot build homes, communities and hope. Appropriate property has become harder to acquire because of rising prices, reduced inventory and availability of property that will meet the needs of our homeowners and be truly affordable.

Recently, there have been very few properties listed for sale and all of those listed in our price range were not appropriate because of the condition or location of the lot/house. With our current home construction project quickly coming to an end and three families still waiting for housing, our Board of Directors and staff began to pray for God to provide the property that we needed as he has so graciously done in the past. I soon received several calls from the **Gwinnett County Police Quality of Life Division** referring several properties that had been damaged by fire. This led to a donation of a townhome and the discounted purchase of a home and a lot. We now have the three properties we need to provide affordable housing for our waiting families, and enough projects to put our sponsors and volunteers to work for the rest of the year. We are thankful to God for this blessing, but we know that the need for property will continue. In late April, we hosted an event to celebrate all of our volunteers, donors and sponsors. 
