Alice Cunningham retires after wearing many hats



When Alice Cunningham was asked to join the Gwinnett Habitat Board of Directors in 2010, she had no idea that in a very short while she would leave retirement and lead the organization as the interim director. In 2013, she led the search for a new director, recommended hiring Brent Bohanan, and then returned to the board of directors as the president.

Next, in 2015, Alice became a part-time employee as development director to build the foundation for a strong fundraising program. Then in 2017, after discussing all that needed to be accomplished in our community to increase affordable housing availability, Brent Bohanan, Don Goldsmith, board president, and Alice attended a workshop about campaigns and fundraising. As a result of that experience, Brent asked Alice to lead our campaign full-time.

The timing was perfect. Never had Gwinnett Habitat had so many families apply to become homeowners or to have home repair or accessibility modifications made to their homes. The rest is history. According to Alice, "Launching a campaign was an exciting next step. I knew we had to do more than what we had been doing to meet the community needs. The opportunity to bring in funding to help more families, neighborhoods, low-income elderly, disabled and veteran homeowners than ever, was a challenge I was ready for!"

Now it is 2019. The launch of the campaign was spectacular. Alice related, "The community made some very generous gifts to help us build and repair more homes and have funds to purchase land as well meet the other goals of our campaign. We have more funds to raise over the next two years, and I am convinced we will meet our goal. I am exceedingly thankful for the opportunity to help more families have a better place to live."

To show their gratitude for Alice's dedication to the organization, the Gwinnett Habitat board of directors renamed the Brighter Futures Fund to the Alice Cunningham Brighter Futures Fund. Alice established this campaign and now her legacy will live on through it.

Alice has retired again and plans to continue volunteering. She has turned over the reins to Randi, a very capable, energetic and experienced philanthropy professional who will continue to build upon the donor base and help even more families in our community.

Make a Bargain Sale



Now, at the end of summer, we have almost completed the first two homes and are just getting started on the last two, which will be completed late Fall.

In the past few months of building, we have had a lot of fun getting to know our newest set of homeowners. These ladies are driven to succeed and provide for their families. They are strong, funny, and have an array of different backgrounds and stories. They have banded together in support and have started a group text, where they are able to compare their experiences and build their relationships. These homeowners support each other on the build sites too, where you can always count on seeing at least a couple of them out at one of the other homes.

This year, these homeowners have been supported by the community through volunteers, sponsors, our gracious Thursday Crew, which is also comprised of volunteers, and past homeowners. Sponsors have brought additional volunteer groups, some from out of state. The Gwinnett Daily Post has been out twice and written some great articles, which is a great place to check back on the progress and stories of these ladies, alongside our website. And our staff has rallied around them in support. We hope when we announce the dates of our first dedications, you will be able to join us in celebrating these victories too.

We are right in the middle of our busy construction season at Gwinnett Habitat. Five new homes are under construction in Lilburn on East Johns Road (behind Berkmar High School). The City of Lilburn is excited about our development and have required some upgrades to improve the community. They hope our new neighborhood will be a pilot for other cities in Gwinnett County.

We are excited because five new homeowners will soon be realizing their dream of homeownership. All of the homeowners are single women with incredible stories and strong determination. Four of

these ladies are parents and the other is providing housing for her sibling. These women have found a new family among each other and will be unbelievable neighbors and friends. This is what Habitat is all about, "Building homes, communities and hope!"

Serving more families with affordable homeownership is just one of the goals of our Better Homes, Brighter Futures campaign. While five homes are currently under construction, we have just secured six home lots for next year and are reviewing two others. Later this fall, we plan to have a strategic plan in place for our first neighborhood revitalization projects.
