A Home Transformed Willie and Chanel's Brush With Kindness

or 22 years, Willie and Chanel called a modest house their home. Willie, an Air Force veteran, and Chanel, who uses a wheelchair, faced the challenges of a home that lacked essential facilities. The absence of a full bathroom and bedroom on the first floor made daily life a constant struggle.

Recognizing the need for change, they applied to the A Brush with Kindness Home Repair Program. Their story touched the hearts of those involved, and it was clear that significant modifications were necessary for their well-being.

Chanel, using her wheelchair, could not navigate the stairs to use the shower or sleep in her upstairs bedroom. Instead, she found herself relegated to a sofa bed in the living room. The situation cried out for a solution, and the Aging in Place Home Modifications initiative seemed tailor-made for them.

Gwinnett/Walton Habitat for Humanity took charge of the project, bringing people together to make a tangible impact on this family's quality of life. The success of this endeavor was a result of collaboration between The Atlanta Regional Commission and three fundholders at the Community Foundation for Northeast Georgia, who provided essential funding to enclose the garage and transform it into an accessible bedroom and bathroom. Two generous in-kind donors, **Bardi Heating and Air**, and **Robinson Electric**, worked seamlessly to extend the HVAC system into the new living space. Bardi Heating and Air provided both materials and labor for the installation, while Robinson Electric equipped the space with a new breaker and disconnect for the necessary electrical components.

The constructive collaboration of these partners not only enclosed a physical space but also created a haven for Willie and Chanel, where everyday tasks became a little less daunting. The story of their home modification is a shining example of compassion, community, and the transformative power of collaboration.

Inspired by the support her family received from the community during her childhood, Ashley now dedicates herself to assisting others. She focuses on providing valuable mental health advice to other teens, through an organization she started called "Bee Happier" with her friends. Another notable project is Study Wolves, a tutoring website created with her best friend, Emily, for fifth graders at Buford Senior Academy. As part of the National Honor Society. Ashley visits the students weekly, helping them improve their math skills.

In 2019, Ashley's mother applied for a home through Habitat for Humanity. After contributing sweat equity to build other houses, Ashley's family moved into their own home in Dacula in 2021. Grateful for the assistance they received, Ashley shared her story at the most recent Gwinnett/Walton Habitat for Humanity fundraiser, expressing her desire to help others facing financial burdens.

Recognized as an AP Scholar with Distinction, she encourages active participation and initiative. Looking ahead, Ashley plans to attend a STEMcentered university to study biochemistry or biomedical engineering. Her dream is to work in a lab, collaborating with other scientists and making significant contributions to our understanding of the world.

Ashley aspires to be an example for other students, especially those who may be shy or hesitant. She wants to be remembered as someone who embraced opportunities, spoke up, and achieved great things through active participation. As she prepares for graduation, Ashley carries a message of self-love, appreciation, and belief in oneself to inspire others on their journeys.

Ashley's mother and Habitat homeowner, Jomayra, shared this about her daughter with our staff, "As a mother, am very proud of Ashley's accomplishments! She brings a lot of joy to our home, and I know she's going to go far in life. She's extremely dedicated and is such a wonderful girl!"
